"SOMETIMES YOU HAVE TO PARK THE CAR AND TAB IT"

So said Lee McDade, visiting us at the school service on Sunday talking about his work with soldiers. Lee is serving with SASRA



(Soldiers' and Airmen's Scripture Readers Association). Layered up against the cold, in combats, with a rucksack on his back, Lee leaves his car at the bottom of the hill and walks for miles in freezing weather over rough, unforgiving, snow-covered terrain, to where a group of soldiers are on exercises. Taking sweets, words of encouragement, and a willingness to endure their discomfort, he gets alongside them right where they are. His effort and preparedness

to give up home comforts mean that soldiers like and respect him.... friendships are formed. When Lee shares what his faith means to him, the soldiers are prepared to listen. When they need someone to trust, they turn to him.

We all know that to achieve anything worthwhile takes effort and commitment. In schools



across the country this month, teachers and students have been getting into work early, using their lunch times and staying late to revise key areas for important exams. In the recent elections, campaigners have been out in all weathers knocking on doors and handing out leaflets to drum up support for candidates. Keen gardeners have been facing the elements and breaking finger nails to take control of the weeds that threaten to overwhelm.

The example of Jesus suggests that God's salvation plan is no different. In obedience to the Father, Jesus endured hostility and persecution which led him to the cross. It wouldn't be long before his disciples also discovered what it was to 'take up their cross and follow him' (Luke 9:23) for the sake of the kingdom.

In the life of our church, where are we putting our effort and commitment? What is our gracious God calling us to do for Him? And when He calls us, are we willing to give our effort and commitment in order to seek glory for Him?

With over 50 people attending every week, and several youth groups, the church caters for those of all ages, with house groups, fellowships, and all-age services.



As a church, we aim to 'produce changed lives and Christ-like people', and to do this we stand on five main principles:

- To worship God
- To care for one another
- To bring people to Jesus and into God's family
- To teach them so that they grow in their relationship with God
- To equip them to serve God

Our church groups aim to bring new people to Christ with activities related to them.

Every Sunday the church meets together at 10:30 am for worship. With plenty of songs that are suitable for all ages - including ones aimed at children - the church caters for everyone. Part of the way through the main service the children & youth leave to go to Crèche, Causeway Kids, and Hype. These groups allow for the younger ones to learn about God in a way suitable for them. Also, on the first Sunday of each month we hold an all-age service where we focus on preaching to all audiences, and we include fun, games, and challenges.



Dear Friends.

We are so grateful for the kind gift of £2000.68 to help the people of Karamoja, Uganda. Your support is most encouraging.

It is absolutely heart-breaking to see people who are forced to drink filthy, bacteria-ridden water. Karamoja is one of the poorest places in the world and they have been in a severe drought for the past four years. To make matters worse, their stagnant water sources are shared by livestock and wild animals. It is a desperate situation that demands a response.

So thank you for responding!

All gifts for this project will be matched pound for pound by the UK Government. Therefore, please be encouraged that your gift will be multiplied!!

This s going to make such a difference to the lives of the people in Karamoja and we will keep you informed of progress with building and repairing the wells. We are planning to start the work on 1 July this year and it will take up to 36 months to complete the 50 wells, but clean water will be reaching communities as each well becomes operational, which should be in December this year.

Beacon Community Church - doing things differently

Beacon Community Church was planted in 2009 by the Eastern Baptist Association and is based in the premises of the former Bacton Baptist Church. Since the beginning we have wanted to do church differently - to see church work in a very rural context. Home Mission support has been a great help over these past five years as we have steadily grown, though progress has been slow at times. Twelve baptisms (plus three more in the pipeline) are encouraging, but we desperately want to see more! Like many small rural churches we can feel isolated and thus greatly appreciate the prayer support of other interested congregations and individuals. Visitors are very welcome!

On most Sundays we would average about 45 people but a much greater number are involved in small groups, parent & toddler, and craft groups. More than simply numbers, we are seeing life change: salvation, water baptism, baptism in the Spirit, people



receiving inner healing from past wounds, physical healing and other breakthroughs. It is wonderfully encouraging to see God at work in this way. But at the same time we are very conscious that we are simply dipping a toe into the ocean.
